

CONFESSION OF FAITH: NICENE CREED


M: Now, eternal God and Father, keep us in the saving faith and so enable us to overcome all things through our Lord Jesus Christ.

LORD'S PRAYER




WORDS OF INSTITUTION


DISTRIBUTION


